

Article II.
INTERMENTS

- Funeral directors must give at least twelve working hours' notice to the Superintendent for all interments.
- When instructions from the owner of multiple graves regarding the location of an interment space in a multi-grave plot cannot be obtained, or are indefinite, the management of the Cemetery may, so as not to delay the funeral, open it in such location as it deems proper, and the Cemetery shall not be liable for any error made in connection with the decision regarding such location.
- The Cemetery shall not be responsible for compliance with any order not in writing, or for any mistake due to the lack of precise and proper instructions as to the particular space, size and location in a multi-grave plot where interment is desired.
- All funerals must be arranged so that the attendants of same can leave the Cemetery before 4:00 P.M.
- All funerals are under the direction of the Superintendent and his or her assistants when they enter the Cemetery.
- In every earth interment, the casket shall be enclosed in a concrete box or vault.
- All opening and closing of graves and niches shall be by workers employed by the Cemetery at rates determined by the Cemetery.
- The Cemetery shall not be responsible for any interment permit nor for establishing the identity of the person sought to be interred or cremated, nor shall the Cemetery be responsible for the embalming of the body.

Article III.
DISINTERMENTS AND REMOVALS

- In case of a removal from one grave or niche to another, a written order of both grave or niche owners is necessary.
- Disinterments and removals will be made at the discretion of the Superintendent. The Cemetery shall exercise due care in making a disinterment and removal but shall assume no liability for damage to any body, casket or burial case or remains container in making the disinterment and removal.
- Single graves revert to the Cemetery after the remains are removed.
- Prices for removals will be furnished upon application at Superintendent's office.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF ST. TRINITY CEMETERY

FORMING PART OF ALL DEEDS AND PURCHASE AGREEMENTS

GENERAL RULES

- The Cemetery will be open for visitors from Dawn to Dusk.
- Work of any description will not be permitted except during the regular working hours, 7:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.
- Visitors are not permitted to pick flowers.
- Children under 16 must be accompanied by their parents or guardians.
- Persons carrying or discharging firearms will be prosecuted.
- Dogs are not permitted in the cemetery unless leashed. Owners are responsible for cleaning after their dogs.
- Any person disturbing the quiet and good order of the Cemetery by noise or improper conduct, or violating any of these rules, will be compelled to leave the grounds.
- Soliciting in the Cemetery is strictly forbidden.

Article I.

GRAVE/NICHE OWNERSHIP

- No grave or niche shall be used for any other purpose than as a place of interment of human remains.
- After an interment has been made in a grave or niche, such grave or niche is not subject to execution of any process of law and owners cannot divide, sell or transfer such grave or niche, or any part thereof, without consent of the Cemetery Board. Any such attempted division, sale or transfer without the consent of the Cemetery Board is a breach of condition by such owner and will preclude the use of said grave or niche thereafter for any purpose whatsoever.
- Grave or niche owners shall not permit interments to be made in their grave or niche for remuneration.
- Interment in any grave or niche will be made only on the order of the grave or niche owner or lawful heir or heirs of such owner.
- If the owner is not living, then interment in such a grave or niche may be made on the order of the person to whom said grave or niche is willed, or upon order of whosoever inherited said grave or niche.
- The Superintendent is authorized to enter any grave and remove any tree or shrub that may become dangerous or detrimental.
- The Superintendent is authorized to refuse interment in any grave or niche against which there is an unpaid charge.
- Deeds to graves or niches are subject to all future rules and regulations governing the St. Trinity Cemetery.

Article IV.

FLOWERS, WREATHS AND DECORATIONS

- Only one flower bouquet per grave or niche is permitted.
- Christmas wreaths, Easels and Wooden crosses are allowed beginning November 1st and will be removed as stated below.
- Easter wreaths, Easels and Wooden crosses are allowed beginning March 1st and will be removed as stated below.
- Glass and ceramic containers, Shepards Staffs, Baskets and other large displays are not allowed.
- Potted plants, Votive lights, Solar lights, Balloons and other unsightly decorations are not allowed.
- Digging and planting are not allowed.
- Christmas grave coverings (mats) are not allowed.
- Funeral flowers will be removed 5-7 days after interment.
- All decorations will be removed during the weeks of February 1st, May 1st and September 1st. Dates are subject to change due to workload and weather conditions.
- The cemetery is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen grave decoration.
- The cemetery reserves the right to dispose of any article that does not conform with these Rules and Regulations.

Article V.

PLANTINGS

- The planting of flowers on graves is not permitted.
- The planting of trees, shrubs and flowers on space set aside for this purpose in accordance with the landscape plans may not be done without consent of the Cemetery Board.

Article VI.

NICHE MARKING

- The primary marking permitted on the door of the niche will be Name and Date of Birth and Date of Death.
- Medallions furnished by the U.S. Government for those who have served in military duty of the U.S.A. will be permitted.
- Medallions indicating fraternal membership will be permitted.
- Advertisements will not be permitted on any niche.

Article VII.

REVISIONS

- These Rules and Regulations are subject to change without notice.

Article VIII.

GRAVE MONUMENTS AND MARKERS

- Monuments shall be set directly in center of a multi-grave lot, with the exception of roadway lots, where monument shall be set in rear center.
- No monument shall cover more space than 7½% of the lot area.
- See Article X for permissible section specific monument and marker type acceptability.
- All monuments and markers must be granite or bronze.
- No monument, grass marker or any other memorial work may be built on a grave or lot, unless complete plans and specifications for same have been approved by the Superintendent.
- Markers furnished by the U.S. Government for those who have served in military service of the U.S.A. will be permitted.
- All orders for foundations must be submitted to the Superintendent. An estimate of the cost will be given by the Superintendent, payment of which must be made in advance. Foundations must be built by the employees of the Cemetery and will be built as soon as practicable.
- The Superintendent is authorized to refuse the erection of any memorial work whatsoever, on any grave against which there is an unpaid charge.
- All persons employed in the setting and erections of any memorial work are under the supervision of the Superintendent. All workmen must comply with this rule.
- Advertisements will not be permitted on any memorial work.

Article IX.

MONUMENT AND MARKER REQUIREMENTS

- Grass marker – a marker whose top surface is level or below the surrounding grass area and is no more than 12” in width and the length is no longer than 60% of the combined grave space widths.
- Slant (including bevel and small upright) marker - a marker whose top surface is no higher than 16” above the base and whose base is no more than 16” in width and 6” in height and the length is no longer than 60% of the combined grave space widths. The upright portion of the monument (above the base) shall be no less than 6” in thickness.
- Monument – a marker whose top surface is higher than 16” above the surrounding grass area and whose base is no longer than 60% of the combined grave space widths. The upright portion of the monument (above the base) shall be no less than 8” in thickness.

Article X.
